John Kalenzi has served at African Evangelistic Enterprise (AEE) Rwanda since May 2000, becoming the Executive Director in 2008. Under John's leadership, AEE Rwanda grew from a small local Christian organisation to the second largest Rwandan not-for profit, winning multiple awards for a holistic approach to poverty alleviation and good governance.

Before joining AEE Rwanda, John served as the World Vision Regional Manager for Southern Rwanda until 2000. He is deeply committed to serving vulnerable communities and has held board positions with several organisations, including International Fellowship of Evangelical Students (IFES), Scaling Up Nutrition in Rwanda, 'Amasezerano' Community Banking (ACB) PLC, Rwanda Renewable Energy, and Fellowship of Interdenominational Christian Organisations in Rwanda.

Prossy's story

AE MISSION UGANDA

Once a prostitute, witch and nominal Muslim, Prossy found a new life after hearing the Gospel of Christ.

For the past year we have been following the story of Prossy, a true follower of Jesus. Formally known as Nyakato, she was once a prostitute, witch and nominal Muslim. Prossy found a new life after hearing the gospel during an African Enterprise mission in Fort Portal, Uganda.

Eventually embracing Christ, she burnt her magical artifacts in a public act of repentance, reminiscent of Acts 19:17-20, where those who practiced sorcery brought their scrolls together and burned

them publicly. It is remarkably the same as Act 9 in Biblical times when Simon practiced magic and had his books burned.

Leaving her old life behind.

Leaving her old lifestyle behind, Prossy's transformation included legally changing her name, as keeping her Muslim name would endanger her life.

With support from African Enterprise Australia, she is now enrolled at the Nile Vocational Institute, learning beauty and hair salon skills and plans to start her own business to secure a future for her children.

It is essential that we pray for Prossy's old friends who long for transformation to Jesus, not just material or vocational training.

May God guide His people.

We thank God for all He is doing and encourage you to keep praying for all African Enterprise Missions. We are truly grateful to God and all His people who have enabled Prossy to be enrolled in vocational skills training.

Supporting refugees in DR Congo

AE DR Congo (DRC) has organised trauma healing initiatives for people in refugee camps in Kinshasa, who are the victims of the civil wars over decades in the country. When people flee to these camps, they arrive with nothing and the living conditions are exceptionally poor – hunger, malnutrition and disease.



Along with the trauma healing initiatives, AE DRC has provided sanitation kits to teenagers in schools where vulnerable girls have received day-for-girl kits.

- The DRC is currently experiencing escalating armed conflict, and over 500,000 people have been displaced from the city of Goma (population 2 million) since 1 January. There is no electricity, water, or Internet, and travel to escape the situation is extremely risky. Families are being separated as they desperately seek safe refuge.

Please pray for the situation and for the AE DRC Team Leader Leonard Kiswangi, his staff, volunteers and their families as they continue to minister despite the extreme challenges.

AE South Africa – Harvest Time Mission 2024

The Harvest Time mission in Johannesburg, in Fourways, Diepsloot, Soweto and the CBD was successful. The Foxfires Team brought the exciting dynamic of Christian performing arts in the open markets, shopping malls and schools, where they also taught life skills with a gospel focus. Students look forward to the Foxfires coming to their school and the team is often overwhelmed by the huge number of students who want to talk to them. We thank God that schools are open to the Foxfires and for the Christian faith to be shared in this way. The mission took the gospel door-to-door, to offices, to the streets, universities and a police station.

Discipling students in Ethiopia

Discipleship is a key aspect of the African Enterprise three-step mission strategy of preparation, proclamation, and preservation. It is through discipleship that we become more like Christ, and it is also through discipleship that we make more disciples.

AE Ethiopia has a robust discipleship program that targets young, school-going people from primary school to University in Ethiopia.

The Students Discipleship program kicked off in July, a time when schools were closed for the long vacation. The program reaches more than 100 cities/churches. The photo below shows primary (grade) 5 students in a classroom in one of the churches in Addis where the discipleship program is being conducted. In this local church more than 300 students are taking discipleship courses.

Church leaders and trainers affirm that this forward-looking program is helping to foster the spiritual growth of children and youth. Students like 7th grader Ephrata, who is in her first year of the Discipleship Program, are showing increased interest in reading the Bible and attending church. Ephrata says:

"...I have learnt that the Bible is the word of God and was written by people guided (inspired) by the Holy Spirit. Because of this we have to study it carefully and obey the word. Now I have committed to reading the Bible frequently. Because of this training, I am becoming more joyful about my Christian life. My life goal is to live a life that glorifies God."

Mission in Harare, Zimbabwe

Over a nine month period, 60 meetings took place to prepare for the mission, including 55 training sessions for local Christians across Evangelical Fellowship of Zimbabwe zones, denominational level and at assembly level for other denominations. Challenges arose, mainly from tighter government restrictions on public gatherings and school ministry.

Despite the challenges, the 10-day Stratified Evangelism mission reached 174,191 people, with 46,358 committing to Christ. A team of 731 evangelists led the effort, including 87 from Malawi, Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, and Zambia.

Sports Evangelism

AE Zimbabwe led a sports tournament in Harare and used this successfully as a platform for sharing the gospel. The photos show the ministry team at work on the sidelines and the winning team showcasing their AE branded jerseys.

Prison Ministry

AE Zimbabwe ministered to 1450 prisoners during the mission and an incredible 850 souls were saved. Buckets and slippers were donated to be used by inmates for their bathing, and were well-received.

Barbara's story

Before accepting Christ, Barbara, a single mother of three, faced deep struggles. After her husband left, she felt rejected and turned to alcohol. Living in an area plagued by drug use and prostitution, her life grew increasingly difficult.

During the mission, she overheard an AE evangelist ministering to young men involved in drugs. Intrigued, she listened, then approached. After accepting Christ, she eagerly shared her newfound faith with friends and neighbours, inviting seven to join her in accepting Christ.

Moving forward, Barbara is committed to changing her life. She has vowed to leave behind drinking and prostitution, and plans to start attending church.

This story is just one of many from the mission, highlighting the transformative power of faith in the lives of individuals facing profound struggles.
