

Solid Teaching for Church Leaders

Theological training for Christian leaders

As some of you may know, we first got involved in the Preliminary Theological Certificate (PTC) course in 2003, when it was taught by Rev Dr Stephen Liggins in Nairobi, Kenya. Since then, PTC has grown to be one of the key pillars of AE's work.

In collaboration with Moore Theological College Sydney, we send Anglican Ministers (from Australia) to teach African students, so that they can go on to share the Gospel effectively with others. There is a strong hunger to learn about God's Word.

Since 2020 we have received over 2,500 enrolments for PTC training across Africa.

In May this year, Rev Dr Stephen Liggins (Springwood Anglican) and Rev Shane Dirks (Figtree Anglican) visited Kigali, Rwanda, to teach the first module of the PTC training: Biblical Theology 1 and the beginning of Old Testament 1. They saw 47 students complete the course and rejoice in the power of the Gospel. At the end of September, Rev Greg and Michelle Ball (St Andrew's Cronulla) and Rev Dan Bidwell (Robertson Anglican) will also visit to complete Old Testament 1 and teach New Testament 1.

This month, students in Harare, Zimbabwe, will continue their PTC training journey, under the supervision of Rev Nigel Parker (St Paul's Shellharbour). We thank these ministers for their commitment and time contributing to this sacred mission.

Mukela, a PTC student shares: "Thank you to AE for providing an environment and a platform for me and many others to know and serve the Lord. I have been equipped and inspired for my present and future ministry. PTC has taught me how to serve God faithfully through a focus on the study of the Bible."

God is working through the PTC course to deepen the theological understanding and ministry skills of churches and Christians across Africa.

Goma Mission

AE DR Congo Team Leader, Leonard Kiswangi and training partner, Jean-Claude Kapagama recently travelled to eastern Congo to reach communities in this war-torn region.

Despite facing many challenges, they arrived safely on 5 June, a powerful testimony to God's faithfulness.

Leonard says: "Over three days of trauma healing sessions, many participants found peace and committed to becoming agents of healing in their own communities.

We are confident that the families we reached will serve as pillars in the journey toward reconciliation and peace.

However, our work is far from over. As we look ahead, we are determined to follow up with essential supplies, including food and medication, for those still in need during this challenging time in Goma.

Chinhoyi Mission

From 29 March to 7 April 2025, AE Zimbabwe ran a mission in Chinhoyi, sharing the love of Jesus Christ with as many people as they could reach. The mission included door-to-door preaching, ministry in schools, hospitals and prisons, in the marketplace and even through sports.

AE Zimbabwe mobilised 28 teams, reaching over 30,000 people with the message of Jesus Christ. Hundreds of people were moved by the Lord and accepted Him into their lives.

South Sudan Mission

Civil war in South Sudan has displaced approximately two million people, including an estimated 750,000 children.

In this turmoil, we see innocent lives marked by tragedy – children created in the image of God who are enduring hardships for crimes they did not commit, facing tribal conflicts they do not understand, and grappling with political and economic struggles that have little to do with them.

Many of these children are physically and emotionally scarred: some have been maimed or burned, and many have lost their parents. It is crucial that they come to terms with their experiences, learn about forgiveness, and embrace reconciliation, rather than bursts of anger and revenge. It is the only thing they know. In the capital city, Juba, one school where we are providing chaplaincy has 50 former child soldiers.

God has opened a door for AE South Sudan to bring hope in the schools. It's an opportunity to provide pastoral care, loving them, teaching them to communicate; all this, grounded in the Gospel.

The Ministry of Education has invited African Enterprise to teach the scriptures and provide chaplaincy in the public schools in Juba. It is a huge task that requires Godly strength and wisdom. Please pray for these children, and support us in this Gospel journey.

Across Africa, AE's youth initiatives continue to thrive.

In Uganda, the Youth Skilling for Employment Project is teaching entrepreneurship and connecting students with job placements and mentors.

And in Ghana, (as we touched on in African Harvest Autumn) students are gaining hands-on training in computer skills, tailoring, bakery and more through our youth empowerment project.

The Change Rack

In March 2025, our church welcomed Simba Musvamhiri and John Kalenzi (AE Rwanda), to share about AE, with a focus on their projects in Rwanda. They spoke about the Centre for Champions (CFC), a vocational training centre that provides skills and opportunities for young people. Sadly, the CFC had recently lost a large part of its funding after an overseas donor withdrew their support.

Around the same time, like many others, I was sorting through my wardrobe in preparation for Winter. I had planned to sell a few things, but after hearing Simba and John's update, I wondered if those clothes could serve a greater purpose. And so, *The Change Rack* idea began to take shape.

With six weeks to prepare, and a wonderful team of helpers, we began collecting clothing donations from our church community, friends, and families. Incredibly, over 1,200 items were donated. We spent weeks sorting, pricing, folding, and getting everything ready. Most importantly, we were upheld in prayer by members of the congregation and fellow believers.

On the day of the sale, the church hall was filled with people browsing clothes, catching up over delicious baked goods or bbq sausages, and supporting the cause. It was a simple but meaningful day of community and generosity. We raised almost \$14,000, far beyond our original goal of \$3,500. The funds will go directly towards supporting young people at the Centre for Champions in Rwanda.
